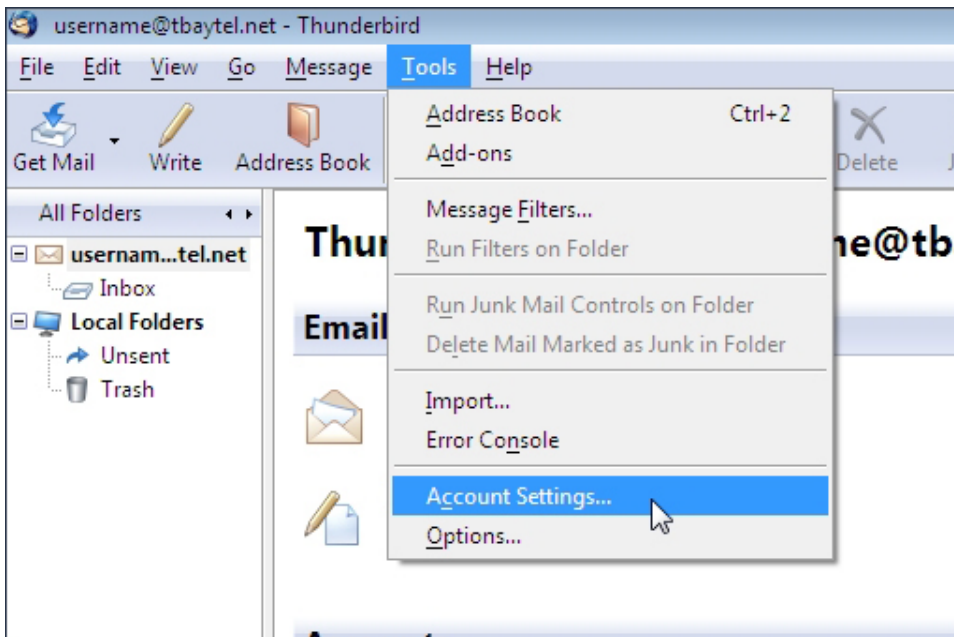
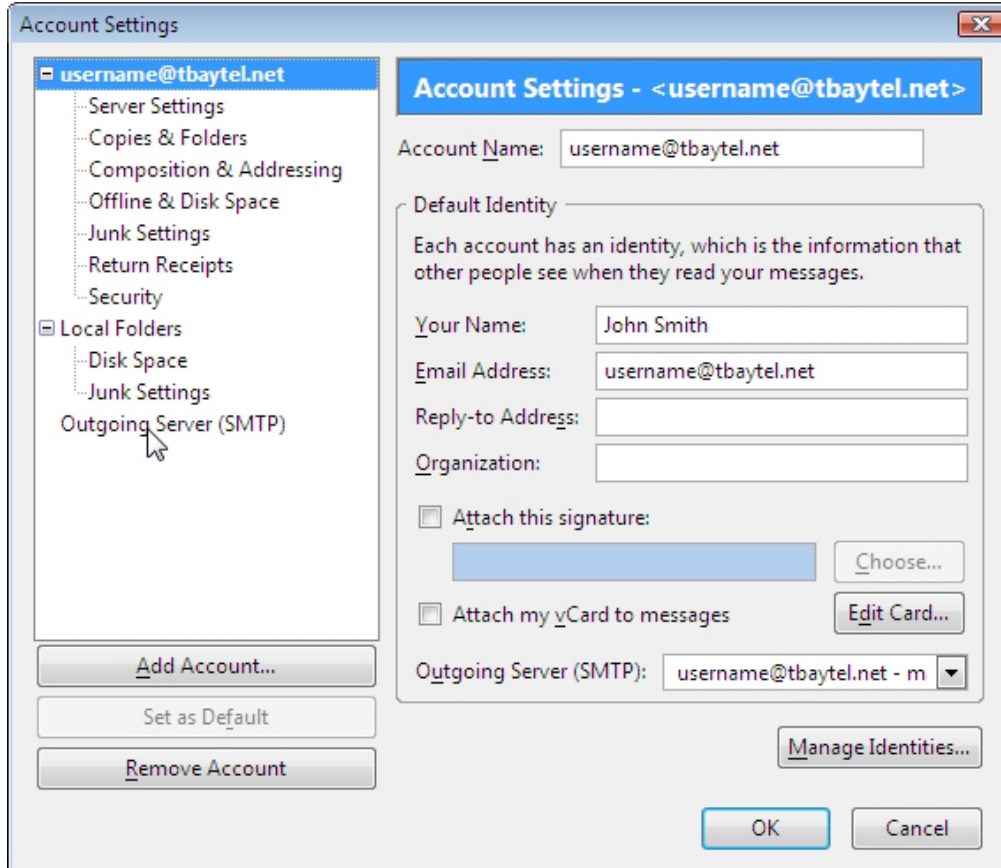


Enable SMTP-Auth for Thunderbird

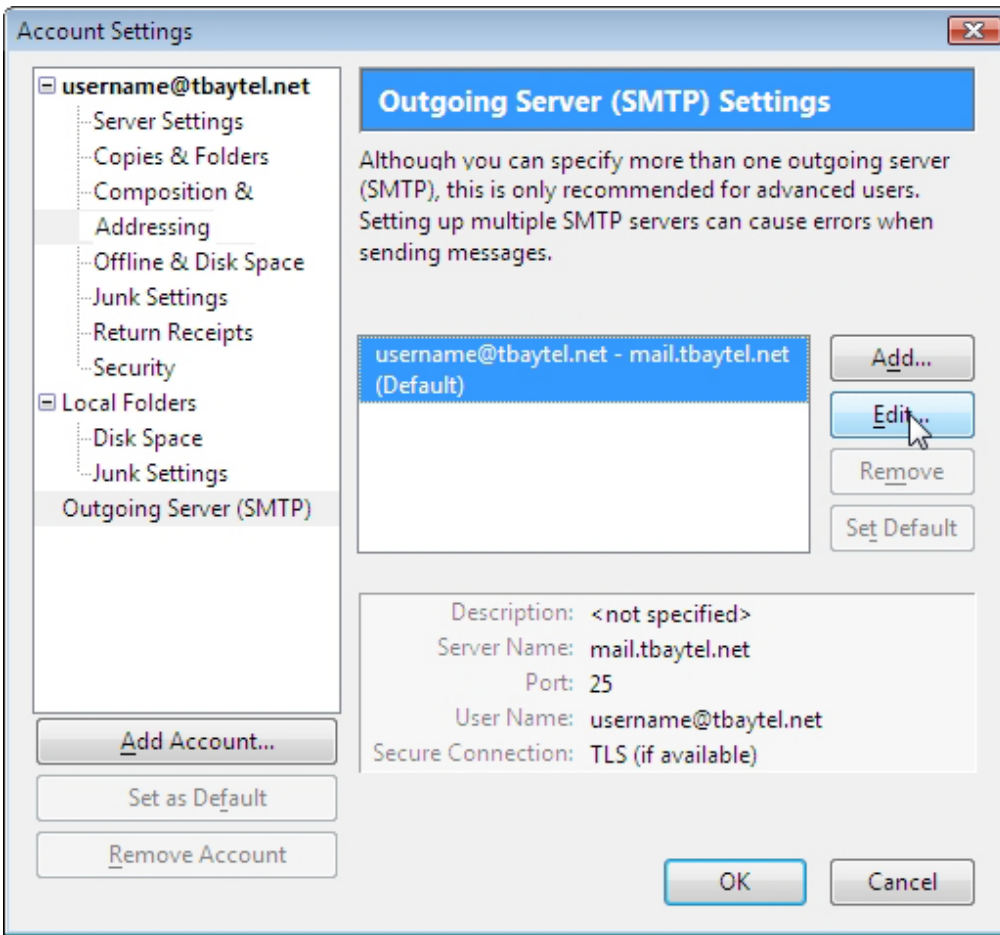
1. Open Thunderbird.
2. Click 'Tools' then 'Account settings' from the drop down menu.



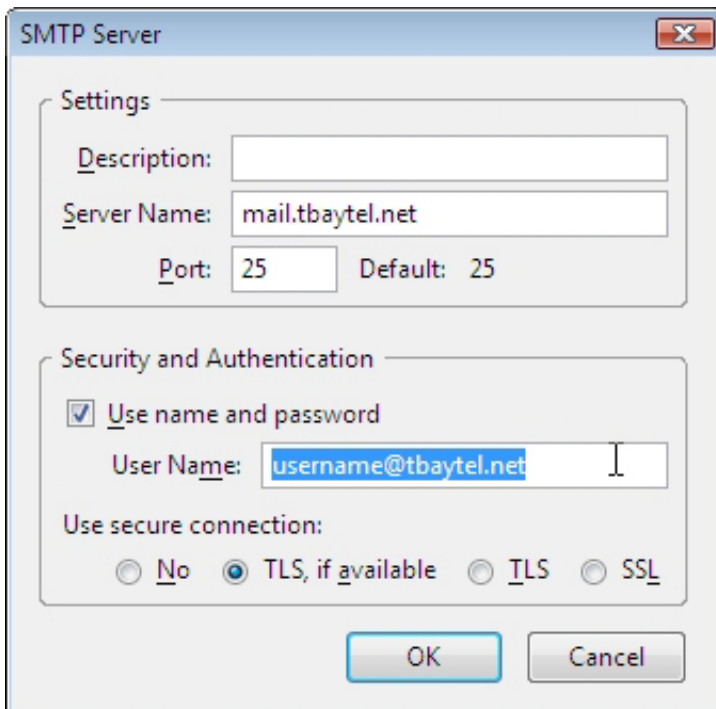
3. Click the 'Outgoing Server (SMTP)' Tab



4. Select your user name (username@tbaytel.net in this example) from the available accounts and click edit or double click your user name.



5. Verify user name is a TBayTel account



6. Change the 'Outgoing mail (SMTP)' port from the default of 25 to 587. This will allow you to use our mail server from anywhere.
